CONGRESS.

The bill providing for the abolition of slavery within the District of Columbia, introduced by Senator Wilson, and referred to the District Committee, was intrusted to Senator Morrill, who has prepared a bill which provides for the immediate emancipation of all the slaves in the District, and for a limited compensation to loyal owners, not to exceed \$500 per slave on the average.

The Finance Committee of the Senate had a dead lock of three and three over the lender clause in the Ways and Means finance scheme, and consequently had to report it to the Senate with the bill; and the amendments upon which they did agree.

Senator Sumner introduced a series of resolutions which are declaratory of the relations between the United States and the territory once occupied by certain States, and now usurped by pretended governments, without constitutional or legal right.

The Treasury Note bill, with some amendments, was passed with only nine votes against it. The interest of the five-year bonds is raised to 7-12 per cent. The notes authorized by the act of July 17 are included in the provisions of this act.

The war news for the past week is exciting and important. At length we are prosecuting the war vigorously. The immense preparations of the last few months are culminating in a series of victories which, let us hope, will speedily crush out rebellion.
