





SUMMARY OF NEWS.

The farmers of Lake County, Illinois, have been so much troubled by the past winter, that it was deemed necessary to take some measures to exterminate these animals. Accordingly, it was given out that a grand hunt would take place on Saturday, March 14th. On that day, some five hundred farmers were at the appointed rendezvous, all well equipped. The party started out and after scouring the woods and swamps throughout the day, the result of their toils was the killing of one skunk, three rabbits, and a prairie chicken.

In Canada, the production of plumbago, for the purpose of employment in the various arts and manufactures in which it is so extensively used, has already made considerable progress. Several associations, on an extensive scale, are in operation in the county of Ottawa; and it is probable that many others will be set on foot in the course of the ensuing season.

The amount of greenback currency now in the U. S. treasury is less than at any time since the close of the war, the bulk of money in the treasury being in gold. The amount of gold in the treasury exceeds \$100,000,000.
