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The sparsely settled parts of those Territories. The Kiowas, Arapahoes, Cheyennes, Navajos, and Apaches have held frequent meetings during the past winter, at which it was endeavored to effect a combination for a general Indian war.

Recent murders and robberies in New Mexico, Arizona, Texas and other places are referred to as evidence of the hostility of the Indians, but whether a complete combination has been effected is not known.

The Tribune further states that a letter from a prominent United States official, dated Fort Sill, June 12th, says that the warlike spirit of the Arapahoes and Arapahoes are organizing ostentatiously for the attack on the Utes of Colorado; and the writer thinks that a raid on the frontier is really their object, and he says the Government authorities are doing all they can to break up the movement.

THE BRITISH ARISTOCRACY. There are in England twenty Dukes, nineteen Marquises, a hundred and ten Earls, twenty-three Viscounts, twenty-four Bishops, two hundred and thirty Barons. All these, with four Dukes (who are Princes of the blood) and the two Archbishops, are members of the House of Lords, as it is usually termed, but as it is more correctly termed the House of Peers. There are ten ladies who Peeres in their own right.

Two of them, the Baroness de St. Leonards and the Baroness of Clifford, wear titles that are more than six hundred years old. Mary Anne Disraeli, the wife of the late Prime Minister of England, was created Viscountess Beaconsfield in 1868.

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Everybody does not know that Barons and Knights are not Peeres. There are a hundred and eighty-eight of the former, and I know not how many of the latter. They are styled Sir John Smith, Sir James Jones, and their wives are called Lady Smith, Lady Jones, and so forth.

The Massachusetts General Association of Congregational Churches had a spirited and useful meeting recently at Pittsfield. The question of the Unitarianism was the subject of the meeting.

The Hartford Theological Seminary has held its 36th anniversary. The Rev. Dr. H. C. Johnson, of New York, was the guest of honor.

Rev. J. B. Jeter, D. D., of Richmond, Va., has been appointed by the Board to visit Rome, for the purpose of attending to the erection of a house of worship in that city.

Fourteen young men graduated last week from the West Philadelphia Divinity School, (Episcopalian), of which they were ordained as deacons. Five others at the same time received priest's orders.

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The Farmers near Norfolk, Va. are harvesting the potato crop, and 400 or 500 barrels are sent daily to the Northern market.

RELIGIOUS INTELLIGENCE. There is still another project of Church union.
