(when they have any,) and the stage passengers find a lodging. We passed through the "Chinese quarter," and although they seem as comfortable as could be expected for so many together, we are sure they will be glad to get ashore. Their berths are laid above each other, like shelves in a chess room, along the sides, and through the middle of the room, and many of them were busy themselves with light entertainments.

27th, Sunday. We are in sight of the shores of Japan, but the clouds prevent our seeing their wonderful mountain, Fuji-Yama. Soon after writing my last notes on Friday afternoon, the wind, which was then rising, blew us up storm. The waves wrought, and were tempestuous all night, but with the morning came a change, and then our accustomed nice weather, and with it, I trust, unfeigned gratitude to "Him who holds the winds in his fist, and the waters in the hollow of his hand," for his continued goodness to us.

Again a ship is in sight, but going the same way as ourselves, so we shall probably have no chance to send this until we reach Shanghai, and send by this steamer on its return.

Evening. On board the "Oregonian," to sail to-morrow noon for Shanghai. We are fairly transferred, have not yet been ashore, and the weather has been showery, but except to go in the morning for a little look about town. We are delighted to learn that a mail steamer will have here on the 7th of next month, so we are in good luck.

We are in excellent health and spirits, and feel that we only need the blessing of him who we believe has sent us, this third time, to these ends of the earth, and our labor will be in vain. We have faith in prayer. So our request to those who love us, and the work to which we have set our hands, is, "pray for us."

LETTER FROM WEST VIRGINIA. NEW SALEM, June 4th, 1878. The second annual session of the South-Eastern Association is just over. Information has been received from London to the effect that the British government has not decided to send the gold to Washington to pay the Geneva award, but to purchase the gold in the market.

The body of Father Anthony Grim, a French Catholic priest, was recently found in the Potomac near Washington. He arrived a few months ago from the Indian country, where he had been serving as a missionary, and is supposed to have committed suicide in a fit of insanity.
