THE ATONEMENT. It may be that the peculiar mission of Seventh-day Baptists is to urge the claims of the Bible Sabbath...

But the ark covered--propitiatory or mercenary--covering the curse, whenever it was sprinkled by the atoning blood; for every year, on the great day of atonement, this ceremonial was repeated to cover the sins from God's sight. Not that the blood sprinkled on the old mercy seat did actually atone for sins, or cover the curse of the moral law...
