From the Syracuse Sunday Herald. THE CHRISTIAN SUNDAY CONVENTION. This Convention during its sessions, brought out many facts, and set forth many important principles, which the various speakers are fully entitled to great credit. And, as is usual for such bodies, the result, though well directed, fits far above the mark, too often, and thereby fails to kill the evils sought to be destroyed.

CONGRESS. MONDAY, Dec. 8. In the Senate, Mr. Chandler presented the joint resolutions of the Michigan Legislature asking for the construction of the Niagara ship canal; also for surveying a canal across the State, which laid on the table. In addition to a number of bills of minor importance, the following were introduced and referred: To restore to newspapers the privileges abolished by the repeal of the franking privilege; to establish a National University of Education and Labor; to incorporate the Eastern and Western Transportation Company. Mr. Clayton submitted a resolution directing the Secretary of the Treasury to consider the expediency of reporting a bill providing for a general system of railroad incorporation, said bill to contain provisions making such terms and regulations for the safety and comfort of passengers as may be necessary from time to time. Mr. Wright, of Iowa, called up his bill, introduced last Monday, repealing the salary increase, and advocated it at length. At the conclusion of his speech he asked that the bill be referred to the Committee on Civil Service and Retrenchment. It was so ordered.

THE PROTOCOL. The protocol of the conference held at the Department of State at Washington on the 29th of November, 1873, between Secretary Fish, Secretary of State, and Rear Admiral Don Jose Polo de Bannabe; Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Spain, is as follows: The undersigned having met for the purpose of entering into a definite agreement respecting the case of the Spanish man-of-war, the United States, which was captured on the 31st day of October last captured on the high seas by the Spanish man-of-war "Tornado," and reached the following conclusions: Spain, on her part, stipulates to restore forthwith the vessel referred to and the survivors of her passengers and crew, and on the 25th day of December next to salute the flag of the United States. If, however, the salute will not be rendered to the satisfaction of the government of the United States that the Virginians did not rightfully carry the American flag, and was not entitled to carry it at the time of her capture, the salute will not be rendered.

FOG IN LONDON.—Last week's dispatches from London, England, spoke of a dense fog that had continued there for several days. No vessels have arrived here for two days, the captains fearing to move during the fog, lest they should come in collision with other craft.' The fog covers an area of about fifty miles square, of which London is the center." Most of them will run with a full complement of hands, but at reduction of wages to 75 per cent. The Jersey City Y. M. C.
