ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT OF ECUADOR.—On August 15, the following account of the assassination of President Garcia Moreno, of Ecuador, South America: The details as brought by the steamer Captain at Guayaquil, which arrived here on the 13th, are to the following effect: The whole city of Guayaquil was thrown into a state of excitement on account of the assassination of Garcia Moreno in his palace at Quito on the 6th inst. by an officer, Capt. Rayo, whom he had displaced from his office, and who was then in Ecuador on business.
