Grant, President of the United States, do recommend to the people of the United States, to devote the thirtieth day of November next to the observance of Thanksgiving, and to pray to Almighty God, and to lay aside their daily avocations and all secular employments, and to observe such a day of thanksgiving as they may deem proper.
